CONSEIL SCIENTIFIQUE INTERNATIONAL POUR LE DEVELOPPEMENT DES ILES**"INSULA"**

1. Association internationale, indépendante, sans but lucratif, pour la recherche multidisciplinaire et l'action en faveur du développement équilibré et durable des îles mineures.

INSULA : Conseil Scientifique International pour le Développement des îles, est une organisation internationale non gouvernementale créée à l'initiative du Programme MAB de l'Unesco en suivant les recommandations des groupes d'experts et d'administrateurs qui se sont réunis dans des séminaires et conférences internationaux de 1986 à 1989, dans le cadre du Projet 7 du MAB "Gestion rationnelle des Ecosystèmes insulaires" (Port-Cros, France, avril 1986, Puerto Rico, novembre 1986; Gomera, Canaries, Espagne, mai 1987 ; Mali-Losinj, Yougoslavie, septembre 1987 ; Ouessant, France, avril 1988 ; Hiroshima, Japon, octobre 1989).

2. Puerto Rico, une rencontre interocéanique : Hiroshima, une conférence "océanique"

A Puerto Rico en particulier, à l'occasion de "l'Atelier de travail interocéanique sur le développement durable et la gestion de l'environnement des îles mineures", les participants, experts, scientifiques et administrateurs, provenant de 19 pays et de cinq différents bassins océaniques, ont reconnu que, malgré les différences de leur société ou de leur situation géographique, les îles, plus proprement océaniques, les autres, longeant les grandes masses continentales, les très nombreuses îles mineures du monde, partagent des problèmes graves et spécifiques à leur condition d'insularité.

Territoires limités et isolés par définition, les îles se caractérisent par des ressources naturelles de base réduites et par la fragilité de leurs écosystèmes, excessivement sensibles tant à l'action humaine directe qu'aux facteurs biotiques ou abiotiques d'origine interne ou externe. Il suffit de penser au problème de l'eau potable, pour les nombreuses populations insulaires de toutes les latitudes, ou encore aux effets dévastateurs des cyclones tropicaux. Les structures socio-économiques à leur tour montrent d'inquiétantes fragilités et une dépendance face aux pays continentaux très difficilement maniable par les insulaires.

Transports, communications, santé, éducation, finances, travail, sont les points faibles, accentués par cette dépendance du monde extérieur, et leur effet sur des démographies galopantes, tantôt vers des excès de population, tantôt vers une émigration qui saigne les forces vives de l'île, s'ajoute à ceux provoqués par l'excès d'exploitation des ressources naturelles durant les courtes phases de développement explosif qui laissent des paysages désertifiés par les hommes durant les longs cycles dépressifs où la pauvreté et l'abandon dominent.

Les récentes années, toutefois, ont ouvert de nouvelles perspectives aux îles mineures dues à l'intérêt social, et sans doute aussi géo-stratégique, montré

par les pays continentaux pour leurs îles, ainsi qu'à l'intérêt des organisations internationales pour les nombreux pays micro-insulaires issus de la décolonisation. Il s'agit là, sans doute, d'une conjoncture favorable aux îles mineures, une conjoncture toutefois qui peut à son tour être à l'origine de nouvelles formes de dépendance qui viennent s'ajouter aux anciennes, amplifiant à terme les contradictions du développement insulaire. C'est à ces contradictions ainsi qu'aux moyens de les dépasser que les 1400 participants au "International Islands Symposium" (Hiroshima, Japon, octobre 1989) ont porté leur attention.

Il convient donc de veiller à la bonne marche des processus en cours et de mettre au service d'un développement social et économique respectueux de l'environnement naturel et culturel des îles toutes les forces, toutes les disciplines, et toutes les expériences d'hommes et d'institutions concernés, afin que, dans un futur proche, les aspirations des insulaires pour une qualité de vie digne de ce nom trouvent des bases solides et durables dans le respect des cultures, des nations et des exigences incontournables de la nature.

Pour répondre à ces objectifs, les experts réunis à Puerto Rico et ailleurs ont recommandé la création d'INSULA, organisation à caractère global, afin de contribuer directement à la mise en oeuvre de politiques saines, tant du point de vue socio-économique qu'écologique, capables d'assurer un développement équilibré et durable aux îles du monde entier.

Ils ont ainsi proposé d'en être les membres fondateurs en confiant au Programme MAB de l'Unesco, aux principes duquel ils adhèrent pleinement, le soin d'entreprendre les démarches nécessaires à la réalisation de leur initiative.

INSULA : CONSEIL SCIENTIFIQUE INTERNATIONAL POUR LE DEVELOPPEMENT DES ILES, réunira, outre les membres fondateurs, des professionnels indépendants de tous pays et de toutes disciplines ayant trait aux problèmes insulaires et accueillera en tant que membres associés, toute institution publique ou privée dont les finalités convergent avec celles exprimées par INSULA et par le Programme MAB de l'Unesco.

3. INSULA : son Programme

INSULA se propose d'agir en tant qu'élément catalytique, afin d'assurer l'application aux spécificités des réalités micro-insulaires de la recherche scientifique multidisciplinaire, de la technologie, et des innovations en matière d'éducation, de culture, et de communication, et de promouvoir un dialogue direct avec/et entre les autorités responsables et les populations des différentes îles elles-mêmes.

INSULA s'appliquera à promouvoir la coopération et l'échange horizontal d'expériences et d'expertise entre îles de la même région ainsi qu'au niveau interrégional, en utilisant notamment les réseaux d'experts et des projets pilotes du Programme MAB.

Enfin, INSULA, grâce à son réseau international et multidisciplinaire d'experts et scientifiques, se propose par son intervention et son assistance technique, de contribuer à tout effort de développement équilibré et durable entrepris par les responsables de la gestion des îles, et de coopérer avec les organisations nationales, régionales et internationales engagées dans des programmes de développement insulaire.
